SKILLED TRADESPERSON

Electrician, Plumber, Pipefitter, Carpenter, Iron Worker, Masons and more. The people that "work with the tools" to build the project.

ESTIMATOR

Interpret plans and specifications to determine the labor, materials and cost for a project.

PROJECT MANAGER

Responsible for planning, coordination and control of a project.

CONSTRUCTION ACCOUNTING

Understanding project accounting, manage accounts payable/receivable, develop budgets, maintain work-in-process schedule.

COMPUTER AIDED DESIGN (CAD) / BUILDING INFORMATION MODELING (BIM)

Create 2-D or 3-D computer modeled building plans.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGER/ SENIOR PROJECT MANAGER

Oversees project managers and the planning, coordination and control of larger projects.

FOREMAN

Oversees crew of tradespersons in the field.

SUPERINTENDENT

Oversees day-to-day jobsite operations, coordinates with project managers and subcontractors/suppliers.
